

The Ten O'Clock Scarf by Debbie Orr

All day, every day, I look forward to around 10pm when I can finally sit down and start my knitting for the day. This scarf was no exception, and every day for about a week, I sat down at 10ish and knitted a few rows until it was finished.

I designed it to be easy for a first lace project. The patterning row is every fourth row, so you have some nice, relaxing knit and purl rows in between. Don't be afraid to experiment with different yarn weights and needle

Finished measurements

Length: 40 inches Width: 10 inches

Materials

Skein Queen Desire (100% superwash merino) in DK.
Colourway: Pigeon Street – one skein – 225m

Recommended needle size

Size 6mm. Circular or straight.

Directions

Cast on 45 stitches.

Row 1 Sl 1 purlwise, K43, sl 1 purlwise

Row 2 Purl

Row 3 –Sl 1 purlwise, K4, K4tog, [YF, K1] x5, YF, K4tog, K9, K4tog, [YF, K1] x5, YF, K4tog, K4, Sl 1 purlwise

Row 4 Purl

Knit to desired length, using a lifeline if needed. End on Row 4. Cast off.

Don't forget to block the scarf when you've finished it to show off the lace pattern to its full advantage.
